- IT Orte, Italy Final event and celebration: youth volleyball match, conference, historical and cultural experiences.

- participants contributed ideas via brainstorming, interviews, and online tools.

- integrating values like teamwork, respect, and selfconfidence.
 - Gender equality: promoting
- leadership roles for women and mixed-gender training.
- Cultural inclusion: using volleyball
- communities and foster European identity.

Each partner presented their club models, youth divisions, and community networks, revealing the diversity and shared values of European volleyball.
